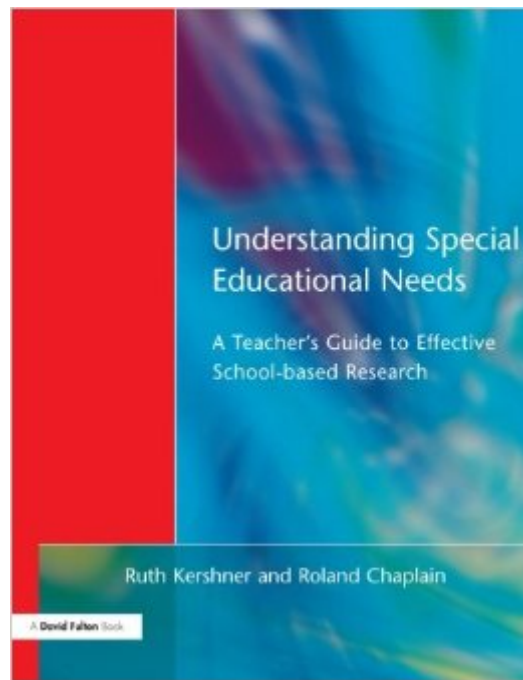


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Understanding Special Educational Needs: A Teacher's Guide To Effective School Based Research
